Property Maintenance

Staff updated Council on our current cases and how making a few changes to the Property Maintenance Code would be beneficial. Changing the method of delivery to include standard mail would be helpful since certified mail can take 30+days to be returned or delivered. We would also like to add language to include outside storage. We have several properties that have various items that are causing major eye sores in our neighborhoods. These changes are used by many other jurisdictions and seem to be beneficial.

Seasonal Alley Closure

Council and Staff discussed the proposed seasonal alley closure for 53 West Market.

Cynthia Stiver, 21 Main Street, stated she was not in favor of this closure for many reasons. This is a residential area, and we already have one alley vacated on this block.

Mark Powell, 33 South Plum Street, stated that he was not in favor of the closure. Residents use the alley, and we just closed one down in the same block.

Staff will have this proposed closure on the next agenda for the Council to consider.
